SPYGLASS BREWERY TOUR




July 13th - We started our Model A tour from Westford town common, good starting place to Nashua! Weather was sunny!

MIDDLESEX CANAL MUSEUM TOUR



We had a great start to the Middlesex Canal Tour on 21 July, with weather cooperating. In attendance with tour leader Harold Samuels were Don Ross, Jim Rousseau, Ed Wlodyka, Harold Legge, Matt Cilley and Parents, Sue and Robert Hart, Doug Farrell, Brad and Kathy Johnson with Grandchildren.

We were met on arrival by Ron Pare, the owner of the Faulkner Mill complex where the Middlesex Canal Museum is located. He provided reserved parking for us. His unique Model A truck was on display with a for sale sign. He is an old car buff and owns several

Thunderbirds of varying vintage as well.

After a brief look at a remaining section of the canal, the dam, and the water still running under the mill originally used for power, we entered the Museum. Russell Silver was the museum host of the day. He showed us around the facility and set up a video for us that documented the history, route, and surroundings of the Middlesex Canal.

In its day, the Middlesex canal was a major commercial force for the area. It carried materials to and from Boston, from as far as Concord New Hampshire via connection to the Merrimack River. The digging of the canal by shovel, construction of locks, embankments, bridges, aqueducts, and holding ponds was an amazing feat for the time, all done by hand. The demise of the canal was brought about by the building of the railroad along the same route. The railroad could move goods at a faster rate with less labor.

After visiting the museum, some of the group headed to Supreme Pizza for the optional lunch, and others headed directly home. All and all, it was an enjoyable and informative Model A day.




