

The Inner Circle

Every club organization has members that participate on a scale of 1 - 10. The 1's and 2's can be referred to "paper" members. That is they faithfully pay their dues and maybe attend a meeting or two a year, but do little else. They all have good reasons for their level of participation and are important to the club. They keep the membership count up and contribute to funding via their dues.

Editorial

Is "inner circle" the proper term for the 6-10 level? The term has been used as a reference to newer members being left out of the loop with partial information on many club activities. In any case, the term has been bantered around with quips and references, usually in a jovial



My references to it in November issue of this publication begat several positive comments like "How do I get in the inner circle?" and "What are inner circle perks, I need perks" etc. These people understood the jest.

However, there was member was offended by the term. So I sought the definition which is: "an exclusive group close to the center of power of an organization or movement, regarded as elitist and secretive".

Sometimes we get caught in repetitive routine activities and inadvertently ignoring newer members, not meaning to do so. Furthermore, contrary to modern social practices of diversity, there is a natural comfort level and a resistance to change causing us stay closest to those in our own circle. These innocent happenings nonethe-less make some members of an organization to uncomfortable feel and equally offended.

It is important reemphasize diversity in talent, interest and commitment does naturally exist in the 10 levels of participation in an organization. However, the heart and soul of the success is the group that often takes on the characteristics of an inner circle and needs to be appreciated.



The following notification was sent out by the Mass Association of Auto Clubs (MAAC) urging Mass car collectors to contact their local representative and members of the Transportation Committee to urge the Third Reading of HB 3064 which will allow the restoration of YOM plates.

Thanks in advance for your help. **Doug**

URGENT LEGISLATIVE ALERT (ACTION NEEDED) Massachusetts Year of Manufacture Registration Plate Restoration Bill; Waiting for third reading

Bill H.3064 Notwithstanding any general or special law or regulation to the contrary, section 6 of chapter 90 of the general laws, as appearing in the 2010 official edition, shall be amended by inserting after the word "section" in line 40 the following: - "However, the restoration of year of manufacture registration plates, painted and restored to their original year of manufacture colors and design, will not be considered altering such registration plates when used on antique automobiles."

We Urge You to Contact All Members of the Massachusetts Transportation Committee (Contact Info Below) and your local representative Immediately to Request Support for H.B. 3064

> Please consider phoning or posting a letter in support of this bill. Email is also acceptable, but may be caught as spam.

- Today if you attempt to register a vehicle with plates that have been restored, repainted or even touched up, the plate maybe rejected. Under the proposed bill, these plates, as long as they are readable, and follow the original color, will be accepted.
- · Restored plates are easier to read, and therefore safer for motor vehicle operators and the general public.
- Plate condition is covered under the registry today, and should not be left to the discretion of the <u>RMV</u> employees, restored plates would eliminate the guess work.


Tech Talk Check Your Gas Gauge Outer Ring Nut.




