NOVEMBER 1989 35 YEARS AGO

John Jacobson was appointed as our Club Rep to plan future Regional Meets: the administration, locations, and financing thereof. Our membership had expressed interest in being an active part of these Regional Meets. Our Holiday Party location for December 7th was scheduled to be at The Natick Officers Club. There was a motion to accept the state of officers for 1990 as presented by the Nominating Committee: President Don Morris, VP Wayne Champagne, Secretary Art Callan, and Treasurer Phil Iorio.

NOVEMBER 1999 25 YEARS AGO

On October 21st we were saddened to hear that Fitz Stevens had passed away at 77 years old. Fitz was one of our original Founders. We had 13 Model As in his procession to the cemetery where he was laid to rest. This year we had SEVENTEEN Minuteman Club Members attending the huge Hershey Flea Market in Pennsylvania. The Flea Market had 11,000 vendor spaces, 50 miles of vendors (if placed end to end), 26 miles of rows, and an attendance estimate of 1/4 MILLION PEOPLE!

NOVEMBER 2009 15 YEARS AGO

This year our Annual Auction would have a new twist. For the first time we would be splitting the proceeds with the owners that brought the item. This is an attempt to have better quality items, and to encourage you and others to bring better items to be sold. There would also be both a regular auction and a silent auction. where the repair could be made that following Monday. It took a little longer to get the replacement spring to arrive but the job was completed and Don got to meet Wayne up close.


You can see in the picture of the spring that it most likely had 3 broken leaves.


