# Tech Tip – Spark Plugs - Jim Townsend

#### **Queen City Model A Club Newsletter**



I see all sorts of spark plugs used on Model A engines and get asked "What is the best one for the A?" Henry Ford selected the Champion 3X. I had a set of original 3X in my phaeton for years and never had an issue. Champion still makes an updated version of 3X which are now pricey but I think proper if you plan to show the car. But why did Henry select this plug design over others? You may have heard the term "Hot" describing the heat range of plugs. This is relative to the temperature produced by the spark plug at combustion time. Compression ratio of the engine and fuel mixture are factors in choosing the right plug. The model A engine has a compression ratio of 4.2:1 which is low in comparison to modern engines. And the fuel mixture is relatively rich. This calls for a spark plug with relatively high heat range. The 3X was an excellent choice. So how does one judge the correct heat range? Place several different plugs side by side and you will note different lengths from the bottom end of the plug measured up to the area where the gasket is placed. Pick one where that length is similar to the 3X and you will have one with a higher heat range level. Think of it this way, the longer bottom end of the plug puts the spark further it will extend into the firing chamber. You will find that the Champion W18 is the closest match to the 3X and will perform equally as well.








The nominating Committee is looking for a someone to fill the Vice President position. Please consider helping the club, with over 100 members we should be able to have 1 person step forward.
